

Homework – Autumn 1

Find a comfortable or unusual spot and see if you can lose yourself in a book. We would love to see a photograph! (Reading)	See how many numbers you can spot in different places outside of the classroom. Can you take a photograph of some of these? Challenge: Pick 5 numbers you have spotted and put them in order from smallest to largest. (Maths)	Draw a self-portrait. You could draw yourself doing one of your hobbies or with something that you like so that we can get to know you! (Art)
Pick a song you and a family member both enjoy. Why do you like it? How does it make you feel? Describe the music (eg. genre, tempo). (Music/Writing)	Practise writing the year 2 common exception words. (These are on the year 2 page of the school website and in the back of this book!) (Spellings)	Would you rather live in a hot place or a cold place? Which country would this be? Explain your choice. (Geography)
Draw a habitat you have visited in your local area, e.g., a river, woodland, the coast, etc. Can you label the different things in the habitat? (Science)	Research and create a family tree. Include links to friends and other people who are special to you. (PSHE)	Make up your own dance routine or movements (either with or without music). (PE)

Every half term, your child will receive a homework matrix. These activities are mostly linked to subjects covered in class. We ask that one task is completed per week (you don't have to do all nine!) and that you initial and date each activity completed. Evidence of homework can be glued into children's books, photographs tweeted or emailed to us, or items even brought into school! We will collect homework books in on a Wednesday morning.

In addition to this, we would also like all children to do the following things weekly:

- Read a minimum of three times to a grown-up/older sibling (please record this in reading records)
- Spend time on TTRockstars/NumBots
- Practise common exception spellings (these are in the back of homework books)

(All passwords can be found in children's reading records).

There may sometimes be an additional, optional reinforcement activity sent home in homework books for children to have a go at.
