

Homework – Summer 2

<p>Find $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{2}{4}$, $\frac{3}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{3}$ of an amount and write down the total. Use physical objects or draw shapes to count. Challenge: Do you notice any patterns? (Maths)</p>	<p>Can you create your own throwing or jumping game? Think about using targets to throw or jump into. (PE)</p>	<p>Practise tying knots with a piece of string or your shoelaces – check with a grown-up first! In DT this half-term we will be sewing and tying knots in our thread. Can you thread a needle? Challenge: Sew a button onto a piece of fabric. (DT)</p>
<p>How many of the Year 2 Common Exception words can you spell? Remember to use the ‘Look, Cover, Say, Write & Check’ method. All words are on the website and in the back of your Homework Book. (English)</p>	<p>In art, we will be looking at sculpture. Design your own piece of 3D art. Think about which materials/objects you would use. How would you position them? Could you make them into different shapes? Challenge: Make your design! (Art)</p>	<p>Write a diary (for no more than a week). Include: the dates, things you have done and your thoughts and feelings. (English/History)</p>
<p>With the help of a grown-up, dissect a variety of fruits and locate where their seeds are. Challenge: Draw a labelled diagram of one or more of the different fruits you have dissected. (Science)</p>	<p>Write some top tips about life in year two for the current year one children. What do they need to know? Do you have any advice for them? (English)</p>	<p>Embed your knowledge of number bonds to 20. You could use Topmarks Daily 10 to help you. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/daily10 Choose: Level 1, Addition, Bonds to 20</p>

Every half term, your child will receive a homework matrix with activities that are linked to what we cover in school. We ask that one task is completed per week and that you initial and date each activity completed. Evidence of homework can be glued into children’s books, photographs tweeted or emailed to us, or items can even be brought into school! We will collect homework books in on a Wednesday morning.

In addition to this, we would also like all children to do the following things weekly:

- Read a minimum of three times to a grown-up/older sibling (please record this in reading records)
- Spend time on TTRockstars/NumBots
- Practise common exception spellings (these are in the back of homework books)

All passwords can be found in children’s reading records.

There may sometimes be an additional, optional reinforcement activity sent home in homework books for children to have a go at.
