<p>Practise your pre-cursive letters. Challenge: Write down any more questions that you would like to know the answer to. (Geography – What are rivers and how are they used?)</p>	<p>Find out about why plants are important! Why are plants important? - BBC Bitesize Challenge: Draw and label the structure of a plant. You could even use a real plant to do this! The structure of plants - BBC Bitesize (Science – Plants)</p>
<p>Make a poster about water safety. How can people stay safe near different bodies of water? Challenge: Raise awareness - teach someone else about how to stay safe! (Topic – Dive in!)</p>	<p>In PE, we are learning how to play tennis. Have a go at passing a ball or soft object to a partner using a racket or something similar. Think about your body position when you are doing this. Every half term, your child will receive a homework matrix with activities that are linked to the topics/units of work we are covering in school. We ask that one task is completed per week. Evidence of homework can be glued into children's books, photographs tweeted or emailed to us, or items can be brought into school. We collect homework books in on a Wednesday morning.

In addition to this, we would also like all children to do the following things weekly:

- Read a minimum of three times to a grown-up/older sibling (please record this in reading records)
- Spend time on TTRockstars/NumBots
- Practise common exception spellings (these are in the back of homework books)

All passwords can be found in children's reading records.

There may sometimes be an additional, optional reinforcement activity sent home in homework books for children to have a go at.
