Core knowledge	 The civilization of Ancient Egypt spanned 3000 years. The River Nile flooded often which made the banks perfect for growing crops. We know about this period of history due to archaeologists including Howard Carter who discovered Tutankhamun's tomb. The pyramids are giant tombs. The Egyptians used hieroglyphics to write things down. This is the oldest form of writing. The ancient Egyptians were ruled by kings and queens who were called pharaohs. Religion was an important part of ancient Egyptian civilisation. They worshipped over 2,000 gods and goddesses!
