<u>Core knowledge</u>	 Slavery is where one person is owned by another. A slave is treated as if he or she were a piece of property and is forced to work for nothing for their owners. Segregation means keeping people apart. In many cases it is a form of discrimination because one group of people is treated unfairly. Rosa Parks (1913 – 2005) In 1955, she refused to give up her seat on a bus to a white person. At that time, white people and black people were kept apart in some American states. Her actions changed American history forever. Martin Luther King Jr (1929 – 1968) He led the fight for equal rights for black people in America. He didn't believe in using violence to change things. He was famous for his powerful speeches. Culture is a pattern of behaviour shared by a society, or group of people.
