There are 190 Teaching Days in a school year.

There are 175 non-Teaching Days in a school year.

10 days of absence over a school year reduces attendance to 95%.

29 days of absence reduces attendance to 85%.

47 days of absence reduces attendance to 75%

Children with over 90% attendance are more likely to achieve five or more A-C grade GCSE's.

Children with less than 85% attendance are unlikely to gain any A-C grade GCSE's.
