This week saw our girls football team perform magnificently at Pindar where they were unbeaten, winning six games and drawing one – this was despite playing with only 5 players in a 7-a-side tournament!

Curriculum - Our curriculum is based on the analogy of a learning journey. Each half-term, each year group starts a new learning journey (topic) with a launch. This is usually an immersive day or perhaps a visitor or an event to get the children



enthused and launch the topic. As the learning journey reaches half-way, each year group receives a boost. This might by a trip, a visit, a visitor or a special event to boost the learning journey. At the end of each half-term, the learning journey reaches its destination. This is often a class assembly or performance, but can also be a trip, or an opportunity for children to share their work with another class.

This week we have seen a number of learning journey 'boosts'. Year 2 found a crime scene in Chestnut Class and the children used their detective skills to work out what had happened and who was the suspect as part of their learning journey, 'Once Upon a Time' and to introduce their new traditional tale, 'Little Red Riding Hood'. The children worked as a team to find clues and evidence to work out what had happened and who the culprit was!
