


## Homework – Autumn 2

<p>Can you research the nurses Florence Nightingale and/or Mary Seacole? Write down five interesting facts.</p> <p>(English/History)</p>	<p>Can you go on a 2-D and a 3-D shape hunt? Take photos of what you find, can you name the shapes and their properties? <b>Remember:</b> vertices (corners), edges &amp; faces.</p> <p>(Maths)</p>	<p>How many of the following jumps can you do in a minute?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Star-jump</li> <li>• Standing long-jump (feet together and jump forwards)</li> <li>• Hop</li> </ul> <p>Try and beat your score over a few days.</p> <p>(PE)</p>
<p>Use a device you have at home to take photographs of an object from different angles (e.g. close-up).</p> <p>(Computing &amp; Maths)</p>	<p>Can you design a new chair for one of your soft toys at home? Draw it and label the features you have added.</p> <p>(DT)</p>	<p>Listen to a piece of music and have a go at clapping the rhythm. Challenge: What instruments can you hear?</p> <p>(Music)</p>
<p>Keep a diary of any activities you have done in a week that show you are keeping healthy and active (e.g. swimming, gymnastics, dancing, football, walking etc). Record how long you did the activity for and on which days.</p> <p>(PSHE)</p>	<p>Make a boat which floats successfully in a container of water and can carry a cargo of at least one penny.</p> <p>Challenge: How many pennies will it hold before it sinks?</p> <p>(Science)</p>	

Every half term, your child will receive a homework matrix with activities that are linked to what we cover in school. We ask that one task is completed per week and that you initial and date each activity completed. Evidence of homework can be glued into children's books, photographs tweeted or emailed to us, or items can even be brought into school! We will collect homework books in on a Wednesday morning.

In addition to this, we would also like all children to do the following things weekly:

- Read a minimum of three times to a grown-up/older sibling (please record this in reading records)
- Spend time on TTRockstars/NumBots
- Practise common exception spellings (these are in the back of homework books)

All passwords can be found in children's reading records.

There may sometimes be an additional, optional reinforcement activity sent home in homework books for children to have a go at.
